1. Message

1.1 Message of the Government Agent / District Secretary - Jaffna



The statistics shows that the Jaffna District Secretariat made impressive contribution to the development process of Jaffna District in the year of 2016.

The Various Projects from fulfilling basic needs of the public up to construction activities were efficiently and effectively implemented through devising best laid plan. The projects for the total value of 5681.09 millions of rupees were completed with the capital allocation several ministries. It is remarkable to note that 99.45% of the allocation was utilized.

A number of specified development programme has been implemented under Ministry of Prison Reforms, Rehabilitation, Resettlement and Hindu Religious Affairs. 

3. Introduction of the District



3.1 Borders of the District:

Jaffna District is the northern end of the Northern Province of Sri Lanka, about 410 km away from Colombo. It consists of the peninsula and seven inhabited Islands. North, East and West boundaries of the District are Indian Ocean, South is Jaffna Lagoon and Kilinochchi District. The total land area including Island waters is 1,012.01Sq.km. Jaffna District is divided into four Sub divisions. They are Islands, Valikamam, Thenmaradchi and Vadamaradchi.

There are 1,084 ponds and 2,433 ditches scattered all over the District with connected channels to conserve rain water. Excess water easily drained into the sea/lagoon. The levels are Point Pedro 15.24m, Myliddy 10.8m, Chankanai 3.04 m and Kokuvil 6.09m respectively above the Sea level.

3.2 Historical Importance of Jaffna District

During the past historical periods kings were ruled this Jaffna Rajadanee from 13th century. This can be proved with the available sources. Nallur was their capital city and Ariya-kings and thereafter the kings of their places ruled Jaffna District. The important spots - Jamuna Eri, Sangiliyan Thoppu frontage Sangiliyan Entrance, Palace for king and queen are some of the valuable places still in Jaffna. The other distinguished places under British rule are Clock Tower, very popular schwas and the broad roads.

They point out the historical marks of the District. The Nallur Kandasamy Temple, Vannarpannai Vaitheeswaran Temple Perumal Kovil, Large Fort are some of the examples of Building structures which shows architecture and gives more information about Jaffna.

3.3 About Natural Resources of the District

Climate: Jaffna District falls under tropical zone. Peak rainfall is during the months from October to December. During North East Monsoon, there is the Scattered during April to May. The inter Monsoon rain is uncertain.

In the year 2015, the rainfall was 1838.9mm, temperature between 25.18-31.73 °C as normally and average temperature was 28.18C.

Soil: The soil and water resource of the Jaffna Peninsula are both related to the limestone geology of the land. The soils are formed on the marine deposits and sentiments under the influence of sea waves and winds on lime stones. Tile limestone being a porous rock is the source of groundwater for the Peninsula. Well drained and high productive calcic Red Yellow latasol and Red Yellow latasol soil types are found in central areas (60,000Ha). Alkalin saline soil and Regasol are found in coastal areas (26000Ha) and Alluvial soil is in Valukai Aru area (10000Ha). In certain areas coral lime stone is available. This different soil types offer scope for cultivation of exotic as well as local crops. Tile depth of soil varies from 90cm-150cm.

Water: Jaffna peninsula has a source of Ground Water store in the Sub terrain layer of limestone. The limestone is the main aquifer. This aquifer can be found several isolated caves and caverns capable of storing ground water without evaporation losses. It is a excellent aquifer. The entire ground water is generated from percolated rainfall and it forms a freshwater lens beneath the peninsula. It is found that the fresh water lens do not extend below the base of the lime stone. The fresh water lens is sustained by the buoyancy of fresh water in relation to sea water. Difference in density, (1.0,1.025) giving a ratio of 40:1. That is every meter of fresh water above the sea level requires a depth of fresh water lens of 40m when no mixing between fresh and seawater takes place. There is no sharp interface between fresh and seawater.

Ground water recharge has been viewed as a function of effective rainfall in the Jaffna Peninsula, this occurs only during the annual monsoon rainfall during the period September to January. After losses by direct run - off (about 10-15 percent), only 30 to 32 percent of the rainfall is left over for groundwater recharge. In the past three decades the quality of water in the region has deteriorated due to various reasons. Variability of the rainfall over the region has directly contributed to this as rainfall is the only source of recharge. The ground water in Jaffna peninsula is in danger due to salinity problem. A significant factor that has contributed to increase salinity in the well water has been the indiscriminate extraction of water from the underground aquifers. This has been exacerbated by the increase in population and the rapid rate of extraction using pumps both electric and kerosene driven for domestic and agricultural purpose. Because of low fresh water heads in the underground aquifers large amount of withdrawals from wells cause heads to further decline and the fresh water salt water interface to rise resulting in salt intrusions in several areas in the peninsula. The Intensive agricultural pattern adopted in the last three decades also led to the increase of salinity in the water. Several wells once used to supply potable water are not in use now due to the increase of salinity.



3.4 Livelihood Patterns of the people of the District or main commercial and economic activities

The livelihood of Public of Jaffna District is mainly depends on Agriculture, Animal husbandry and Fishing. Some of them are adhere self employment and Home Industries and get income for their life.



3.5 Irrigation System of the District

Water Resources in Jaffna District

Jaffna peninsula unlike other parts of the island there are no streams or rivers in Jaffna Peninsula, where the land is largely flat. In addition, the topography does not permit construction of reservoirs. This makes ground water is the prime source of the Jaffna peninsula and hence, it largely depends on the annual rainfall received mostly during October to December monsoon rains. Ground water has been the "life blood "of the Jaffna peninsula, there are four aquifers (underground reservoirs) such as valikamam aquifer, Vadamarachchi aquifer, Thenmarachchi aquifer and Kayts aquifer as shown in the below figure.



The Jaffna peninsula is blessed with 1,250mm of annual average rainfall over an area of about 1,000sq.km producing 1,250MCM of rainwater. Water supply requirement of Jaffna is only 51MCM, which amounts to less than 5% of the rainfall. Up to about the nineteen sixties and seventies, even with a greater population than at present, people of Jaffna were able to sustainably meet their water requirement. Agriculture demand of Jaffna is approximately 150 MCM.30% of rainwater goes to sea without using and 50% of rain water loses due to the evaporation.

Fortunately we have potential surface water sources such as Ponds(minor Tanks), fresh water Lagoons, drainage scheme and Salt water exclusion schemes. There are over thousand ponds scattered all over the peninsula and conserve the precipitation to provide water for cultivation of small extents around the ponds and to recharge the aquifer. There are three lagoons which are internal lagoons (vadamarachchi lagoon and upparu lagoon) and external lagoon (Elephantpass lagoon)



The ponds are badly silted due to many years of usage and the capacities are reduced. A program to rehabilitate, improve and desilt the ponds will increase the water resources potential of the peninsula.

The Vadamaradchi Lagoon starts near Uduthurai & Pachilaipalli area and ends at the entrance to Thondamanaru sea mouth with surface areas of about 77 square km consists of 22 nos of flood protection bunds. The main features of Vadamaradchi lagoon are given below.

Catchment area - 115 sq. miles.

Lagoon water spread - 30 sq. miles.

Upparu Lagoon is a natural lagoon has an outlet structures called barrage, which is located across the sea outfall at Ariyalai between 195 & 196 mile post along Kandy – Jaffna road. Further a separation bund of 4.40km isolating the lagoon from Chemmany Salterns and Paddy fields. This barrage is used to regulate the flood water flow in to the sea and to prevent sea water intrusion in to the lagoon. The main features of Ariyalai Barrage are given below.

Valukkiyaru is a drainage scheme that drained the water from the western sect of the Valikamam area and is covered by four Divisional Secretariats for administration. It contains catchments of 57sq.km in Valikamam North, Valikamam South, Valikamam South West & Valikamam West associated to towns Tellipalai, Uduvil, Sandilipay & Chankanai respectively. This scheme was initiated in 1948, had been operating successfully until the early 80s and had gone into dilapidation since then owing to lack or care and conflict related activities. It has to be emphasized that most of the population were displaced from these areas during these periods primarily in 1985 and 2001, which had a significant impact on the deterioration of the system. Valukkai aru main channel with the length of 14.5km drains the excess flood water to sea and it consists 08 tributary channels which connects ponds to the main channel and help to drain excess water.



SWE Schemes were built not only to prevent the seawater intrusion but also to facilitate to release flood water during floods. Salt Water Exclusion Schemes and flood protection bunds are essential for conservation of underground water and to convert the low-lying coastal area free from salinity and make the peripheral lands arable with increased productivity in the Manavari cultivation. There are 34 nos of SWE scheme bunds in the coastal area of Jaffna peninsula.

3.7 Rainfall pattern of the District


The climate of Jaffna is determined by the monsoon that forms a wet and dry season in the District. The major rainy season occurs during the North East monsoons from October to December and the minor rainy season occurs during the South West monsoon in April and May. The period between the South West Monsoon and the North East Monsoon is the dry season extending from June to September. The average rainfall is 1300mm but is highly variable, spanning a range of 630mm to 1780mm


A distinctive feature of the district is the underground formation of lime stone, in which ground water is stored at depths of 6 to 14 meters. The water is extracted through about 110,000 open dug wells for domestic and agricultural purposes. Surface water is scarce compare to other district, although, the Peninsula originally had two major lagoon schemes, 34 nos. of salt water exclusion schemes, drainage scheme and about thousand small ponds which retained the monsoon rain water which then percolated into the surrounding wells during the dry season. Now many of these schemes ponds have fallen into silted up and dilapidated condition due to poor maintenance. During the late seventies and early eighties the agricultural activities in the Jaffna Peninsula was at its peak. They lift the necessary water from the underground aquifer. In the earlier days either by their own manual effort or with the aid of animals, now water pumps are used for this purpose and water laboriously lifted from the underground source.

Jaffna depends on the underlying limestone aquifer for its water and the capacity of the aquifer was stretched to its limits. Some of the dug wells, the principal source for fresh water, went dry and many others became saline due to salt water intrusion.



5.1.14 Statistics Branch Activities

- 1) Paddy Statistics Maha 2015/16: Sown extent was collected by the Divisional Statistical Officers (S.O) / Statistical Assistants (S.A) from Grama Officers (G.O) during months of October to November in a prescribed form called as P1 then divisional level summary was prepared by the respective S.O / S.A which is known as P2 and finally District level data could be identified for Sown and harvest where the data for non harvested extent was collected to calculate harvested extent. District summary was sent to Agriculture division of DCS for further analysis.
- 2) Crop Estimation Survey on Paddy-Maha 2015/16: Initially farmers of parcels were selected using random book by officers (SOO/SAA) who were assigned to D.S divisions, the selected farmers were from particular villages which were sent by head office in every year in order, that there were 40 villages sent by head office. In a particular village there would be two plots from a parcel, in which Crop Estimation Survey was carried out by S.OO/S.AA, A.II and D.OO during the period of March and April .The Crop cutting Officers used standard forms such as CC1,CC2 & CC3 when the survey was executed and also crop cutting method was strictly applied by them ,Test checking plots were supervised by DSTN,AD Agriculture, AC Agrarian Development and D.SS, Duly completed CC4 was sent by test checking officers to District Secretary. From this survey results yield per acre could be calculated after that the National (Island wide) level paddy production was calculated ,it was concerned an important data for the paddy production.
- 3) High land Crops –Extent and Yield for Maha and Yala Season: The land utilized for High land crops statistics was collected in two seasons during the year in which permanent crops were included in Yala season sown and yield data were collected in HL register in Divisional Secretariat divisions by S.OO/S.AA these statistics were given by G.OO. District summary was prepared according to the divisional summaries called as HIC1,HIC2 and H2. Average yield per acre of the crops was given by the AIIs.
- 4) Live Stock Statistics: From this year newly LQ form was introduced to collect Live stock statistics on June 2016 in which total list of live stock operators (Agriculture Operators) were listed by every Grama Officers divisions. It was able to display total number of animals' milk production in litres and number of eggs produced per day. District summary (LQ2) was prepared on basis of divisional data. and sent to Agriculture division of DCS.



- 5) Annual Survey of Industry, Trade & Service -2016: In addition to the previous year's annual survey of Trade and annual survey of Service were included in 2016. Selected institutions were sent by head office using standard sample selection methods. S.OO/S.AA were responsible to collect the data (2015 data) from the Institutions. Special Training Programme on Annual survey of ITS was conducted by the Industrial and Construction division of DCS to all the S.OO/S.A who involved in the activities.
- 6) Local Government Statistics: The statistical data of local government of Jaffna district for the year 2016 were collected from all local government bodies by using L.G.S form. There were general information, number of employees and wages, the service delivered by the local government, classification of receipts, vote particulars, analysis of expenditure and summary of estimated revenue for the year 2016. The statistical data were sent to Publication division of DCS.
- 7) **Slaughter house Statistics:** Number of animals slaughtered in Slaughter house in respective local bodies was collected by field officers of DCS. The data sent to Publication division of DCS.
- 8) **Building Statistics:** The above statistical data were collected by monthly in all the local government bodies of Jaffna district. New format was introduced from this year 2016, key responsibility of the data was commissioner/Secretary /and followed by S.OO/S.AA. Collection period was first week of each month and the particulars were sent to Industrial and Construction division of DCS.
- 9) Locally Produced Agricultural Products (LPAP): The Producer prices (farm gate price) of local products such as Cereals, Vegetables, Starchy Foods and Onions, Fruits, Condiments, Fish and Fresh Water Fish, Milk, Eggs and Dried Fish, Livestock and Miscellaneous For the year of 2016, the prices were collected monthly in selected main and other producing centers in every Divisional Secretariat divisions by using LPAP form and sent to Agriculture and Environmental division of DCS. Updated form was used from this year. The data are used for PPI.
- **10) Town Prices:** Prices were collected from markets, shop and other institutions with in Jaffna town area and it would be sent to the Prices and Wages Division head office, this process was under went to the quarterly scheduled calendar
 - ✓ Group I: The retail prices of open market are collected in each Tuesday.



- ✓ Group IA: The prices of goods and beverages were collected twice a month. (Tuesday)
- ✓ Group II: The prices of the non-food items were collected once per month.
- ✓ Group III: The retail price of service and other consumer goods were collected once per quarter year.
- 11) F1 updating for Surveys: Listing operations were performed in six or seven Census blocks in every month during the year 2016 Listing updating was carried on F1 forms which were sent by Sample survey division of DCS, these updated units information were transferred in 9NHSP form and sent to Sample survey division. These listings were used to labour forces surveys and income and expenditure surveys for the year 2016.
- 12) Household Income and Expenditure Survey-2016: Generally the HIES is conducted over a period of 12 consecutive months to capture seasonal variations of income and expenditure patterns in Sri Lanka. The general sample size is 25,000 housing units which is adequate to provide reliable information down to district level. The HIES 2016 was the nineth in its series. The field work of this survey was carried out during the whole year 2016.HIES was conducted Island wide in 2016. Approximately sixty to seventy housing units were selected per month in Jaffna District. The survey was conducted by our field staff as three times visited per housing unit on a specific week The collected data were entered in a specific software package.
- 13) Labour Force Survey-2016: The labour forces survey was carried out in same sample of income and expenditure survey field work of the survey was carried out from January to December 2016, for 12 months period in all districts. This report is based on a sample of 25,000 housing units and provides national, provincial and district level estimates with a stipulated standard errors of labour force characteristics as reported in the relevant reference period. The DCS has planned to conduct survey on next year by CAPI system.
- **14) District Statistical Hand book:** The district statistical hand book was prepared in every year by the respective district statistics branches of the Department of Census and Statistics. The data collected from 34 government institutions.

- **15) Child Activity Survey:** This special survey was conducted at selected G.O divisions, in Jaffna district. A team headed by Statistician including our officers to involve the activities and had done successfully.
- 16) Demography and Health Survey 2016: Regarding this survey, two teams were set up with potential staff by the head office, each team headed by a supervisor. Jaffna, Mullaitivu and Mannar were covered by these teams when the survey had executed. CAPI system was introduced first time in the history of data collection system in Sri Lanka. Huge e-questionaire was used to collect data from selected households this survey was mainly focused on children and mothers, to identify health factor BIO marker data were also collected by medical staff. Survey was carried out throughout the months April to August .A team extended their duties at Puttalam district also.
- 17) Census of Public and Semi Government employees: Actually once in four years this survey was performed but there was a eight years gap due to the last Census of population and housing. Five training classes were conducted for the concerning staff of Govt. & Semi Govt. Institutions in Jaffna district The Census was conducted on 17/11/2016 and successfully completed.
- **18) Annual Survey of Construction:** This Survey was the usual performance in every year, in this context selected contractors were interviewed by our staff and proper data were acquired.

I. 9th National Scouts Jamboree – 2016:

9th National Scouts Jamboree was held on February 21st to 24th February 2016 at J/ Jaffna Central College. Central Environmental Authority displayed models of Solid Waste Management Systems and video presentations.





II. Training Programme for School principals in Jaffna District – 2016:

A Training program for Jaffna District School Principals was held on June 5th 2016 at District Secretariat Auditorium.





III. World Environment Day – 2016:

To mark the World Environment Day, a programme was conducted on 9th June 2016, at Kaarainagr Yalton College by Central Environmental Authority. Awareness programme and tree planting event were held on that day.





IV. A Training for Environment Pioneer Programme Teachers' in - charge - 2016:

2. Housing Scheme

Houses were provided to 3140 internal displaced families and returnees from India with the cost of Rs.0.8Mn. The beneficiaries had been prioritized based on the following criteria such as, Women headed families 876, Death due to war families 528, socially integrated families 413, Injury due to war families 608, families under the poverty 715.

A part from the above 610houses was provided to the IDPs in welfare centres, who have land to construct their houses within the peninsula.




